1) About the European Social Network

The European Social Network (ESN) represents the voice of public social services as employers, managers, funders, planners, deliverers, and inspectors of social services in Europe.

ESN inspires social services leaders to improve the lives of people in the community through the development and exchange of knowledge to improve policy and practice in public social services, including all support and community-based services fighting poverty, promoting social inclusion and autonomy, child protection, protection of people with disabilities, care and support for older people, homeless people, as well as people and families in disadvantaged socio-economic situations.

2) About the European Social Services Index

The <u>European Social Services Index</u> (SSI) is an initiative launched by ESN in 2023 to better understand and compare the situation of social services in different European Union (EU) Member States.

Each year, with the support of our SSI Working Group, we gather national data about several countries' social services legislation, expenditure, and coverage. In 2025, we collected data from 17 countries: Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Spain, and Sweden.

The data collected helps us provide evidence for the European Commission to formulate its recommendations to national governments within the framework of the <u>European Semester</u> – an annual review of national economic, social, and budgetary policies aimed at identifying socio-economic challenges in EU Member States and formulating proposals on how they could address these. ESN gets involved in this process to ensure that the European Commission fully knows the situation of social services and that its recommendations meet social services' needs.







On 14-15 October 2025, the members of our SSI Working Group and European Commission officials will meet in Brussels, Belgium, to discuss the evidence we gathered and assess how this can be used to feed into the European Semester.

3) Subject and tasks

As part of the SSI initiative, ESN collects data through a questionnaire completed by the members of our SSI Working Group, comprised mostly of social services professionals, national authorities, and experts. We then analyse this data and draft country-specific factsheets, highlighting our findings.

The expert we are seeking will be required to compare the collected data and draft a cross-country analysis. The final output will be a report similar to those produced in 2023 and 2024. Both factsheets and the final report will be drafted in English.

The expert's tasks will consist of the following and are estimated to require **10 days** of work for completion:

- Cross-analyse 17 country-specific factsheets and draft a report outlining comparisons and formulating recommendations for both national governments and the European Commission. The report should be structured similarly to the 2024 report and cover key findings concerning social services legislation, expenditure, and coverage. The latter will focus on long-term care services for older people and adults with disabilities, child protection, domestic violence support services, minimum income schemes, and housing and homelessness support.
- Present the main findings of the cross-country analysis at the in-person meeting in Brussels, accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation.
- Implement the feedback provided by ESN and finalise the report, emphasising key issues for social services in the framework of the European Semester.

5) Required expertise

- Strong knowledge of social policies in individual EU Member States and at the EU level.
- Strong knowledge of the European Semester.
- Experience in both quantitative and qualitative research and the ability to analyse complex statistical data and draw comparisons.
- Excellent writing and communication skills, with the ability to convey complex ideas clearly and concisely.
- Fluency in English, both written and orally.

Experts are requested to submit a financial proposal for the work outlined above. The maximum remuneration available is €6,300. Payment will be made upon delivery and approval of the agreed deliverables and submission of an invoice.
